Subrecipient Vs. Contractor Under the UG

The Uniform Guidance includes new language on determining whether a relationship should be characterized as a subrecipient or a contractor ("contractor" replaced "vendor" from the previous circulars).

Subrecipient

- -Carrying out a portion of a Federal award and creates a Federal assistance relationship
- -Can decide who to subaward or contract with to perform scope of work
- -Performance measured in relation to whether objectives of the Federal program were met
- -Has responsibilty for programmatic decision making
- -Is responsible to adhering to applicable Federal program requirements (the UG, specific program terms and conditions)
- -Funding is used to carry out the program for public purpose, not for providing goods and services for the benefit of Astate

Contractor

- -Purpose is to obtain goods and services for our use and creates a procurement relationship
- -Provides the goods and services within normal business operations
- -Provides similar goods and services to many different purchasers
- -Normally operates in a competitive environment
- -Goods or services provide necessary support to the operations of the Federal program
- -Is not subject to Federal program requirements, but must meet Astate rules and regulations
- *Per the Uniform Guidance, Astate must use judgement on assigning the subrecipient or contractor classification, and the substance of the relationship is more important than the form of the agreement.
