ADMISSION INFORMATION

Admission to the Physical Therapist Assistant Program is a competitive process. To be considered for admission, applicants should:

- Obtain admission to Arkansas State University
- Be aware of the University General Requirements for Associate Degree found in the A-State Undergraduate Bulletin.
- Possess the skills and abilities outlined in the Abilities and Skills of the Physical Therapist Assistant document located in the application packet
- Complete the PTA Prerequisite Coursework

APPLICATIONS

Applications can be downloaded from the program website. The application deadline for any given year is March 1.

ADMISSIONS PROCESS

Applicants are evaluated on the following factors:

- A. Academic/Cognitive Measures
 - 1. Cumulative GPA (10%)
 - 2. Prerequisite Coursework GPA (25%)
 - 3. Reading Comprehension (25%)
- B. Non-Cognitive Measures
 - 1. Observation and Volunteer Forms (20%)
 - 2. Interview (20%)
- C. Bonus credit is given for bilingual applicants who can demonstrate fluency in use of the Spanish language.

Applicants are chosen based on cumulative GPA, prerequisite GPA, reading comprehension and volunteer/observation scores. The top applicants will be invited to participate in a structured interview process. Following the interview, the top 30 applicants will be chosen for the program. The remaining applicants will be designated as alternates. In the case of a tie, the final decision shall be made by the PTA faculty in conjunction with the chair of the Physical Therapy department.

Admissions policies and procedures are reviewed/updated annually. Applicants should check with a PTA adviser to make sure they have the most current materials. If you have additional questions about the application or admissions process, please feel free to contact the Physical Therapy department.



MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of the Department of Physical Therapy is to educate physical therapy professionals, to enhance the intellectual growth of our students, faculty and alumni, and to enrich the lives of all individuals and communities in the Mississippi Delta region and beyond.

THE PTA PROGRAM

The Physical Therapist Assistant Program at A-State is an associate-level program that results in the awarding of the Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree. The program is designed to prepare a generalist physical therapist assistant and to foster lifelong learning and development. The program includes one year of prerequisite coursework and one year of professional coursework. The prerequisite coursework must be completed prior to admission to the professional coursework.

WHAT IS A PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT?

The physical therapist assistant (PTA) is a healthcare provider who assists the physical therapist in the provision of physical therapy and may perform physical therapy interventions selected by the supervising physical therapist. The physical therapist assistant works under the direction and supervision of the physical therapist, helping manage conditions such as back and neck injuries, sprains/strains, fractures, arthritis, burns, amputations, stroke, multiple sclerosis, birth defects, injuries related to work and sports, and others.



PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANTS WORK IN A BROAD RANGE OF SETTINGS. INCLUDING THE FOLLOWING:

- Hospitals
- Outpatient clinics
- Rehabilitation facilities
- Skilled nursing, extended care, or sub-acute facilities
